

Davis International Scholars Program <u>Information for Candidates and their Families</u>

Overview

ASSIST works closely with the 5 independent boarding schools belonging to the Davis International Scholars Program. Because of this, candidates can express an interest in being considered for both scholarship programs – ASSIST and Davis.

The Davis Program

The Davis International Scholars Program offers students the opportunity to earn a scholarship to attend an independent boarding school in the U.S. that is a member of this program. Students attend the schools for two or three years and stay to earn a diploma. After graduation, if students are accepted to any one of 95 universities in the U.S. affiliated with the Davis Program, funding from the Program continues at \$25,000 per year for four years.

The number of Davis Scholarships is limited so we advise candidates to apply for an ASSIST scholarship in addition to a Davis Scholarship. After the interviews, if students in the scholarship competition are chosen to become Davis Scholarship candidates, they will apply directly to one of the Davis schools for admission. There is no program fee charged to families, but families must pay the personal expenses of their children (airfare, spending money, health insurance, books and supplies, etc.).

Applicants selected as finalists and who indicated an interest in the Davis Scholars Program in their application must complete the **Family Financial Declaration** form through the applicant portal – <u>https://assistscholars.schooladminonline.com/users/sign_in</u> – and submit it by the deadline provided by your country coordinator or ASSIST. The funds are reserved for students whose families genuinely need financial assistance.
